AURELIO MUSI, I viceré spagnoli nella cultura politica napoletana del Seicento

This article shows as Spanish viceroys in the Kingdom of Naples are regarded and represented by the Neapolitan political and historical culture: from the development of powers of this institution under Philip II to the end of XVIIth century. In the age of the Spanish imperial system, the Neapolitan culture devises some political models of viceroy. For Giovanni Antonio Summonte, viceroy is the surety for the relationship between «nobiltà e popolo». The «ceto togato» regards the viceroy as a part of a «limited Monarchy»Giulio Cesare Capaccio regards the Court of viceroy in a baroc society. Finally, in the end of Spanish imperial system, Domenico Antonio Parrino shapes a continuity between the two king's bodies and the two viceroy' bodies.
